

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Ezekiel 17:22-24

P: The Old Testament Reading for the Third Sunday after Pentecost is from the 17th chapter of Ezekiel.

²²Thus says the Lord GOD: "I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of the cedar and will set it out. I will break off from the topmost of its young twigs a tender one, and I myself will plant it on a high and lofty

mountain. ²³On the mountain height of Israel will I plant it, that it may bear branches and produce fruit and become a noble cedar. And under it will dwell every kind of bird; in the shade of its branches birds of every sort will nest. ²⁴And all the trees of the field shall know that I am the LORD; I bring low the high tree, and make high the low tree, dry up the green tree, and make the dry tree flourish. I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it." (ESV)

¹We know that if the tent, which is our earthly home, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ²For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, ³if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. ⁴For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

⁶So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, ⁷for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil. (ESV)

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 4th chapter.

²⁶[Jesus] said, "The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground. ²⁷He sleeps and rises night and day, and the seed sprouts and grows; he knows not how. ²⁸The earth produces by itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. ²⁹But when the grain is ripe, at once he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come."

³⁰And he said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable shall we use for it? ³¹It is like a grain of mustard seed, which, when sown on the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth, ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes larger than all the garden plants and puts out large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

³³With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it. ³⁴He did not speak to them without a parable, but privately to his own disciples he explained everything. (ESV)





THE THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

The Cross of Christ Is the Tree of Life, Which Bears Abundant Fruit after Its Own Kind

The parables of our Lord convey the mysteries of the kingdom of God to those who are "able to hear it," that is, "to his own disciples," who are catechized to fear, love and trust in Him by faith (Mark 4:33–34). He scatters "seed on the ground," which "sprouts and grows" unto life, even as "he sleeps and rises" (Mark 4:26–27). "On the mountain height of Israel," He plants a young and tender twig, and it becomes "a noble cedar." Indeed, His own cross becomes the Tree of Life, under which "every kind of bird" will dwell, and in which "birds of every sort will nest" (Ezek. 17:22–25). His cross is our resting place, even while now in mortal bodies, we "groan, being burdened" (2 Cor. 5:1–4). Yet in faith, we live for God in Christ, who for our sake "died and was raised" (2 Cor. 5:15). We know that, in His resurrected body, "we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens" (2 Cor. 5:1).



SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDIES


Classes meet at 9:45AM.

"Blessings in Disguise: A Study of Jesus' Sermon on the Plain."

On Sunday, June 13, at 9:45AM in the Fellowship Hall, Pastor Mark will begin a new Bible study entitled, "Blessings in Disguise: A Study of Jesus' Sermon on the Plain."

Although Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) is well known, His Sermon on the Plain (Luke 6) packs a powerful message too. Not as well known, this



sermon of Jesus is just as challenging to Jesus' followers and every bit as comforting.

Unique to our Lord's sermon in Luke, His four beatitudes ("blessings") are paired with four jolting condemnations ("woes"). The sessions of this Insight course follow this built-in outline. Used as a tool to dig into Scripture itself, this course can help today's Christian find Christ's power and encouragement in His Word, especially at times when the cross of discipleship grows heavy and is full of splinters.

COVID PROTOCOL CHANGES FOR REDEEMER

In view of the CDC's recent counsel and the ending of the facemask mandate from the Lancaster County Health Department, please note the following changes concerning our COVID protocol.

Registration for worship is no longer required. However, we still ask all worshippers to complete and return an attendance card.

Ropes on the pews in the main nave have been removed. Worshippers should observe common sense distancing. Ropes will remain for the time being in the west wing. Those who feel more comfortable with every other pew being roped off are invited to sit in the west wing. Overflow seating remains in the Fellowship Hall.

Facemasks are no longer required in church, but still recommended for those who have not received their vaccinations. Anyone who feels more comfortable wearing a mask should feel free to do so.

Balcony seating is unavailable at this time.

Greeting fellow worshippers during the announcements has resumed.

Sanitizing of pews on Sunday after the 8:30AM service will take place only for the pews in the west wing. The entire church will be sanitized once a week on Thursdays.

Three entrances (the two in the main narthex and the one in the west wing) will be open and available for entering or exiting the church on Sundays. Due to security concerns, the doors in the west wing will be available only for exiting the church on Saturday evenings.)

Offering boxes will be available in each narthex, along with boxes containing attendance cards, bulletins, etc., and hand sanitizer.

Communion distribution will be by the continuous style for the present time.

Ushering out will start from the back of the church in both the main nave and the west wing.

SUNDAY SCHOOL TOPICS: Preschool – Grade 5

Lesson 9 – June 13

As we gather today, we will study "The Restoring King." Josiah becomes king of Judah at only eight years old. During the eighteenth year of his reign, Josiah begins the restoration of the temple. When they clean the temple, Hilkiah, high priest and Josiah's faithful teacher, discovers the Book of the Law. Hearing the words of the Law, Josiah tears his clothes in repentance and directs Hilkiah to inquire of the Lord concerning the people. The Lord responds, telling Josiah that because of his penitent heart He will hold back the disaster from Josiah's kingdom.

Lesson 10 – June 20

"A Fiery Marvel" is the title of today's lesson. Despite King Nebuchadnezzar's directive to bow before his golden statue, three faithful Israelites ignore the order. In a burning rage, the king orders Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to be tossed into a flaming furnace heated seven times hotter than usual. To the king's astonishment, four men appear in the furnace, and Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego emerge unharmed—not even smelling of fire. Realizing the power of God, Nebuchadnezzar promotes these faithful men and praises the true God.
