



THE INVOCATION, CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

P (Pastor): In the name of the Father and of the ♥ Son and of the Holy Spirit. C (Congregation): Amen.

P: The time of Christ's coming is at hand; the day is drawing near.

C: Let us lay aside the works of darkness; let us put on the armor of light.

P: Lest that day surprise us unprepared, let us confess our sins to God our Father, imploring Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us His promised forgiveness.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

C: we confess that we have sinned against You by thought, word, and deed. We have grown complacent and content, desiring darkness rather than the light. We are helpless to free ourselves. We beg Your mercy for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, who will come again to judge the living and the dead.

P: He who is coming has come! His birth among us brings us light; His death for our transgressions brings us life. For His sake Your sins are forgiven!

C: Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord. Even so, come, Lord Jesus. Amen.

THE SERVICE OF THE WORD

THE INTROIT (Spoken)

C: We bless you from the house of the LORD.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

P: The Old Testament Reading for The First Sunday in Advent is from the 2nd chapter of Isaiah.

¹The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

²It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, ³and many peoples shall come, and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob. that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares. and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. ⁵O house of Jacob. come, let us walk in the light of the LORD. (ESV)

³⁶[Jesus said:] "But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. ³⁷As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in

marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, ³⁹and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. ⁴¹Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left.

⁴²Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect. 



THE FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

The Lord Comes in Meekness and Humility to Save Us Now

The Lord Jesus enters Jerusalem "humble, and mounted on a donkey," riding on "a beast of burden" (Matt. 21:5), as He Himself bears the sins of the world in His body. Now He comes by the ministry of the Gospel to save us from sin, death, the devil and hell. Therefore, we sing, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Matt. 21:9). For we are called "to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob," His Holy Church, "that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths" (Is. 2:3). By His Word, we "walk in the light of the LORD" (Is. 2:5). That is to live in love, which "does no wrong to a neighbor" (Rom. 13:10). We "cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light," for "salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rom. 13:11, 12). Hence, the entire Christian life is a time to wake and watch, "for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (Matt. 24:42).
